## Broken Dreams and Blessed Realities - John 20:11-18

Change: A letting go and a grabbing on

Spring: New greenery means a newer plant, things shed and added Humans: New cells replace old, memory built and trimmed

Time Marches On: We can get mired in the past good and bad Try to hold on without embracing the present and growing Keeps us past focused and hope deprived

Mary's grief: Rabbi is dead and missing. Why does she seek him? Her dreams lie shattered before her

How does she move forward with an unattainable assumed future How do you manage life with broken people and broken dream

Hope: Remember the promise and trust in its fulfillment

Then she hears her name. Rabbi, Don't hold on I must go You must go. Will She Listen? She must let go to gain better Abandon Her will for His will

Will she love him or herself more? It is a matter of "wills"

C.S. Lewis: Love is an affair of the will. Mere Christianity

Pride inhibits love: Pride is about competition-My will "The greatest sin with the greatest misery." I awis

"The greatest sin with the greatest misery" Lewis

Luke 22:39-44 If you are willing, yet not my will Angels strengthened still in anguish kept praying Disciples: Spirit is willing but the body is weak

On the Cross: An act of will to love your neighbor when your neighbor includes your enemy

Pressed not Crushed Perplexed not in Despair
Persecuted not Abandoned Struck Down not Destroyed

2Cor 4:13-18 The will to trust results in thanksgiving

Don't lose heart: outward wasting away inwardly renewed With fixed eyes on the unseen promised eternity

The one who raised Jesus will raise us

Hope in the next world causes us to act in this world Lewis Hebrews 12:1-3

For the Joy set Before Him – Living the Promise today Throwing off the old
